Services: Provides support services for veterans and families. (SSVF)

- **Veterans:** Provides free services to veterans of low or very low income, who are currently homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless within the next 14-21 days. These veterans are assisted with access to needed services allowing them to successfully transition from homelessness to permanent stable housing or to maintain the housing they presently occupy. Case management is usually provided for 90 days. These veterans not only learn to manage housing expenses on their own but may also receive financial aid, assistance with employment, budgeting and legal services upon request.
